Norfolk County Sherriff Program – have high school students help seniors with computer, tablets and electronics. The Are You OK program is also available, maybe advertise in the Money Saver.

Collaborations: work with Park & Rec to do more intergenerational programs.

ACES: The Board of Health will take over the program, Amanda will be in touch.

Schools: The high schools seniors will be meeting and talking with the COA seniors about their life experiences and share stories. This is a type of autobiographical program that will last for 6 weeks.

Library: Gene met with Ann discussing ways to collaborate with the seniors. The paintings the seniors did at the last paint class are on display at the library.

Molasses Flood Talk: by Derrick Gunn on April 13th. The COA van will be available.

Population Figures: the latest figures show that 40% of the town population is 50 years and older.

Temporary emergency home delivered meals: A senior asked to have an in-house meal delivered if they usually come to lunch but are unable for an extended time. We have a contract with Old Colony Elderly Services not to deliver meals.

Other: Sonny Mercuri terms expires in 2020, Karen will talk with him soon to see if he wishes to continue to be on the board.

Vista Volunteer – is a no cost 2 year program.
