DOG LICENSE – LATE FEES

Avon residents are required to secure a license for their dogs. Those who have not yet received a 2023 license can still do so but will have to pay an additional \$25 late fee. Here is what you



need to know about licensing your dog:

- Licenses are valid from January 1, 2023 until December 31, 2023
- All dogs six months and older must be licensed on an annual basis
- You may license your dog by mail, provided you include a copy of a current rabies certificate and a selfaddressed stamped envelope. If you are licensing your dog for the first time, please provide proof that the animal was spayed or neutered
- If your dog's rabies information is up to date, you may license your dog online by going to the following link: https://www.avon-ma.gov/town-clerk-registrar-voters/pages/dog-licenses
- Any resident aged 70 or older is exempt from the annual fee

STAFF SPOTLIGHT

Jonathan Beder - New Town Administrator

1. What inspired you to pursue the career you have today?

a. I started working for the Town of Stoughton Engineering Department in 1997. Holding every position in that Department over the span of 12 years provided me with tremendous insight into most municipal functions within the Town Hall. I thoroughly enjoyed all the attributes of the municipal world and made the decision to pursue a Master of Public Administration degree. In 2009, I then became Stoughton's Assistant Superintendent of Operations at the Public Works. I never thought I would leave Stoughton, but in March of 2011, I was hired as Director of Public Works in Plymouth, MA. Plymouth really developed my skillset for managing in the public sector. After more than a decade as Director, I knew that I had outgrown the role and desired new challenges.



2. What is your favorite hobby?

a. My favorite hobby is carpentry/working with my hands. I enjoy the vision and planning elements that go into the projects. I have worked for a residential builder and a large heavy/highway contractor but doing things for myself without any external pressure is by far the best. No matter how hard I work it feels natural and relaxes me.

3. What's the next place on your travel bucket list?




