Mr. Mooney announced that the meeting is being recorded by Avon Cable. Roll call was taken with those present.

Bill

A motion was made by Mr. Mooney to pay a Beta group bill in the amount of \$3626.64. Seconded by Mr. Costa. Vote: Unanimous. Roll call: Mr. Mooney voted aye, Mr. Mekjian voted aye, Mr. Canducci voted aye Mr. Costa voted aye. Motion carries.

Discussion

Mr. Mooney received a notification from the Massachusetts association conservation commission fee of \$60.00 for continued presence per each member.

Old Business

Abbreviated Resource area of delineation (ANRAD) for Antone Road Continues.

Mr. Mooney read the legal advertisement. Public Hearing was postponed from tonight's December 10, 2020 meeting to December 17, 2020.

New Business

RDA 4 Lawson Street

Peter Lyons representing Collins Civil Engineering. Mr. Lyons displayed plans of a septic repair the tank is located 50ft off the wet land when proposed 70ft off the wet land. Replacing the existing septic and leaching area placing in front corner of lot veering away from resources area a strait forward septic tank repair would be made.

Mr. Mooney asked where erosion control will be placed. Mr. Lyons replied with the erosion control would start at the southern lot line and make its way towards the rear of the property towards the shed. The second would wrap around the tank work and end at the foundation.

Mr. Mooney read the legal advertisement. Mr. Lyons did not have a DEP number yet. The commission expressed that they cannot issue anything, but they can vote on it. Mr. Lyons presented to the board the plans for septic tank in the rear of the house then provide a new septic tank and pump to the right front of the property. Mr. Mooney led the discussion of erosion control. The conclusion was either a 12-inch silt sock or a 6-inch silt sock with a silt fence

Mr. Mooney read the legal advertisement. Bill Self presented the project for amended tanks. Mr. Self presented his project to the board. Mr. Self and Mr. Mooney had a discussion regarding the overgrown bason. Mr. Holmes Stepped in stating that cut down phragmites in winter left to regrow to flower to be treated in September leaving native cat tails. Mr. Mooney expressed he had never received any plans or update from the past year. Discussion of the access road being seeded also regarding the stones one the property. Discussion of issuing a certificate of compliance. The Commission decided to move the public hearing to next Wednesday December 16th, 2020 at 2PM
