

INFORMATION FROM THE OUTREACH DESK

Changes to Real Estate Tax Exemptions – See if You Qualify Now

The May 2, 2023 Annual Town Meeting made changes to Avon's Real Estate Tax Exemption categories. The age to qualify for Elderly exemptions was lowered from 70 to **65**. Income and whole estate limits and exemption amounts were increased. Qualified homeowners over age 65 may be eligible for a real estate tax exemption of **\$1,000** (previously \$750). The income limits for Elderly (Clause 41C) have been raised to \$25,000 for single filers and \$40,000 for married filers, minus a Social Security allowance that is adjusted yearly. The whole estate limit is \$40,000 if single and \$55,000 if married. The exemption amount for legally blind persons is now **\$600**. The exemption amount for disabled veterans (Clause 22) is now **\$500**. (Additional clauses exist for veterans with certain disabilities due to injuries in the line of duty and their surviving spouses.) The exemptions amount for Elderly & Surviving Spouse (Clause 17D) is \$200. Clauses referring to tax exemptions and deferrals are found in Mass. General Laws Chapter 59, Section 5. Real Estate Tax Deferrals

Under Clause 41A, seniors may also be able to <u>delay</u> payment of their property taxes. A property tax deferral does not eliminate the tax obligation like an exemption does. Instead, it defers payment until the property ownership transfers. Taxpayers who receive an exemption may defer all or part of the balance of their reduced taxes. The Town can place a lien on the property to collect the unpaid taxes with interest. If qualified for a tax deferral, the homeowner must enter into a written agreement with the local assessors. Mortgagees, joint owners and remaindermen (from Trusts) must give written approval. Interest on deferred taxes accrues at 8%, or a lower rate if the town has adopted one. Homeowners' gross income cannot exceed \$20,000 unless the Town has adopted a higher income limit. The law allows an income limit up to the "circuit breaker" state income tax credit for single filers.

8 Things to Have Your Doctor Check After a Fall

- 1. An underlying new illness (e.g., UTI, dehydration, anemia, pneumonia, Atrial fibrillation, mini-stroke)
- 2. Blood Pressure and pulse when sitting and when standing. Some medications can cause drops in blood pressure when standing.
- 3. Blood tests (e.g., sodium too high or too low, blood sugar, any abnormalities)
- 4. Medications review. Many medications that increase fall risk can often be reduced, or even eliminated. Ask about sleeping medications, blood pressure and diabetes medications, "anticholinergic" medications, opiates for pain, and antidepressants.
- 5. Assess gait and balance. Address any pain or discomfort, consider physical therapy.
- 6. Vitamin D. Studies suggest treating low vitamin D levels may help reduce falls.
- 7. Underlying heart or neurological conditions.
- 8. Vision, feet & ankles, and home safety.
