Medicare Savings Programs – NEW Income and Asset Limits for 2024

As of March 1, 2024, <u>there will no longer be an asset limit for Medicare Savings Programs</u> in Massachusetts. A Medicare Savings Program (MSP) can help pay your monthly Medicare Part B premium. It can also help pay deductibles, copays and coinsurances in certain cases. If you qualify for a MSP, you automatically qualify for the Extra Help program, which helps with prescription drug costs. The income limits change each year on March 1. In early 2024, the single and married income limits were \$2,734 and \$3,698 gross monthly income. Check with Louise at 774-480-5352 or go to:

Caring for the Caregiver Webinar – Thursday, March 28 at 12:00 PM

The Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs offers a webinar series to provide family caregivers in Massachusetts with simple tips, practical solutions, and information on community resources to support loved ones and care for themselves. Family Caregiver Support Program

The Family Caregiver Support Program at OCES offers individuals and caregivers a range of services to help people stay in their own home and community. The FCSP helps caregivers to make informed decisions, solve problems, reduce stress and maintain their own health. Staff provide one on one support for counseling, coaching, and case management. They can provide resources (e.g., medication dispensers, music & memory programs, animatronic pets) as well as memory cafes, support groups, respite care, and caregiver training. Adult family members aged 18 and older providing care to people age 60 or over or caring for someone of any age with Alzheimer's disease qualify for FCSP services. Grandparents or older relatives who provide care to children under the age of 18 or people over age 60 who provide care to adults with disabilities also qualify for the program. Grief Support Groups

Old Colony Hospice & Palliative Care facilitates free Grief Support groups to the community at various locations in the region. There are specific groups for ages 60 and older and groups for Spouse/Partner loss. Some groups require advance registration while others allow you to just drop in. Grief groups offer social support and a safe place to progress through the grief process.
