


Senior Tax Work-off 2025

INFORMATION FROM THE OUTREACH DESK

Improving Communication with People Living with Dementia

People with Alzheimer's disease or other types of dementia often come to live in an altered reality. They may struggle to maintain their senses of time and place. To a person with dementia, their perceptions are very real to them. As the disease progresses, they can become agitated or upset if their concept of reality is challenged over and over again.

Different forms of validation are accepted as a practical way of interacting with people who have dementia. "Validation" is recognizing that a person's feelings or opinions are valid or worthwhile. Validating a loved one's perceptions and emotions helps reduce stress and improve communication. It increases a sense of happiness for people living with dementia because they aren't continually being told that they are wrong and confused by truths that they cannot fully understand or remember.

The idea of validation stems from an empathetic attitude toward our loved ones. We learn to effectively validate their thoughts and experiences by making ourselves see the world through their eyes. Validating your loved one rather than correcting them is life-enhancing for both of you. It is an expression of kindness and respect that helps them feel heard and prevents you from starting unnecessary arguments you will never win.

When you validate your loved one, you enter into their world. You do not have to pretend that it's real or correct. You explore the needs and feelings of the other person, accepting those as important and real. Here is an example of validation, rather than correction: "Oh, Mom, I'm sorry you're so scared that someone is out to harm you. That must be a terrible feeling. What would make you feel more safe right now?" Validation is about letting the person with dementia be heard, acknowledging their feelings, and offering comfort, support, and safety. It's not about correcting or arguing. If you are caring for a person with dementia, practicing validation could reduce stress and frustration for you and for them.

<u>Dementia Live Experience – October 19 4-6PM. You MUST sign up in advance.</u>

Dementia Live is a simulation experience that briefly puts you in the shoes of a person with dementia, experiencing sensory change and cognitive impairment. This experience is recommended for caregivers or anyone who knows a person with dementia. You will gain understanding of the constant struggles affecting people with dementia as they go about their daily lives. You will also gain tools to improve your communication and engagement with them. The entire experience takes 30-40 minutes. Education is provided by Old Colony Hospice & Palliative Care through the AGE-u-cate Training Institute. You must reserve a timeslot in advance. Call the COA at 508-559-0060. Open Enrollment for Medicare October 15-December 7

It happens every year at this time, but most people don't fully understand what it is. If you are on Medicare, and you have a private Medicare supplement or Medicare Advantage plan, Open Enrollment applies to you. Even if you have a \$0 premium Medicare Advantage plan, plans can change as far as what medications they cover, the copays, preferred pharmacies, and the network of providers. Open Enrollment is the time to review your current insurance and see if it will continue to be the most cost effective plan for you in the new year. SHINE counselors offer free, unbiased information to help you find the right coverage for you. They can also look for ways to save money on your prescription drugs. 
