Dog Licensing

All dogs over the age of six months, must be licensed according to Massachusetts General Law Chapter 140, Section 137.

The dog licensing period is from January 1st to December 31st.

Annual Fees:

Spayed/Neutered:\$10.00NOT Spayed/Neutered:\$15.00

Late fees are incurred as of June 1st: \$25.00 per dog

To license your dog, you must provide an up to date rabies certificate as well as proof of spaying or neutering.

First time licenses can be done either at the Town Clerk's Office or by mail (licensing form can be found on our website).



Understanding Your Voter Status

Complete your Annual Census Form to Maintain your Active Voter Status

- Annually, in January, you will be sent a street listing census form.
- You must complete this form and return within 10 days of receipt.
- Failure to complete the annual street listing form shall result in removal from the active voting list and may result in removal from the voter registration rolls.

Inactive Voters

Registered voters who do not respond to the annual street listing by June 1st are considered inactive. Inactive voters are required to complete additional forms and show an ID at elections in order to vote. Completing these forms at an election does not update your census — you must return a census form to become active and avoid completing these forms at future elections.



Voter Registration

Deadlines for Voter Registration

In order to be eligible to vote in an election, primary, or town meeting, your voter registration form must be hand-delivered or postmarked to the local board of registrars or Town Clerk by the deadlines below:

At <u>least 20 days</u> prior for State Primary, State Election, or Town Elections

At least 10 days prior to Special Town Meeting

How to Register to Vote

You can register to vote in several ways:

- **In Person:** Come to the Town Clerk's Office and complete the affidavit of registration.
- **By Mail:** Complete a mail in registration and mail or deliver to the Town Clerk's Office.
- At the Registry of Motor Vehicles: You can register to vote or change your registration at the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

Your Voter Registration does not follow you if you move

- You must re-register in your new community to continue to be a voter.
- If moving to another community in Massachusetts, once you register in your new community you will be removed from the voting list in Avon.
- If you move out of state, please notify the Avon Town Clerk's Office in writing.
- If moving within Avon you must notify the Town Clerk to change your voting address.
